

# Calculating Your GPA

## California State University University of California

The **CSU's require** that you calculate a self-reported GPA on the college application. Although UC's do not require a GPA on the application, it is important for you to be aware of your college GPA (which can differ from your high school GPA).

To calculate your college GPA, use courses that meet the UC "A-G" requirements on your transcript or the approved course list taken in the 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade only. You may add extra honors points (8 quarters) for UC-approved honors classes only for classes taken in 10-12<sup>th</sup> grade. These classes are underlined on the approved course list.

If you repeated a course, use the higher grade when calculating your GPA. If you received a "D" or "F" in a course and will not repeat it in time to receive a grade, you must use the existing grade.

To Calculate GPA:

$$\frac{\text{Grade Points + Honors ( 4 )}}{\text{Total Courses ( 1 )}} = \text{College GPA}$$
